POOR BOX DONATIONS SEPTEMBER 22 - NOVEMBER 23 BENEFIT KENNEDY HOUSE Located at 532 Spruce Street Reading, Kennedy House, under the direction of the Poor Sister of Saint Joseph, has served

the poor and hungry of the area for over 50 years. The soup kitchen serves meals to between 85 and 200 or more people each Saturday and Sunday, and on Thanksgiving, Christmas, and Easter from 11:30 am to 12:30pm. In addition a food bank, open on Wednesdays from 8:00 to 11:30 am, supplies food to meet basic nutritional needs to low-income residents in Berks County. According to an August 2019 edition of the Reading Eagle, Kennedy House grew from the work of Monsignor Dennis Rigney, who was assigned to Saint Peter Church in Reading in 1966 to work with the Spanish speaking population. A printed history of the organization includes a quote from Monsignor Rigney stating: "It soon became apparent that in addition to the need for church services, many social programs were needed to help alleviate some of the problems of intercity residents and migrant workers, especially among the Spanish speaking." The Eagle report continued to explain: "He formed a clothing and home-goods donation center, Casa Monserrate, Casa is Spanish for house and Monserrate was for Our Lady of Monserrate, sometimes called the Black Madonna. The name was a way to let black and Spanish-speaking people know they were welcome." Quickly the need outgrew the space and in 1968 an abandoned store, now the Spruce Street property, was purchased, renovate and renamed the Kennedy House to honor the lives of John F. and Bobby Kennedy
