TODAYS READINGS

First Reading: Deuteronomy 6:2-6

Moses commands the people to love and fear God, and always keep the commandments that they were given. He tells them to observe all statutes so that they will continue to grow and prosper, and tells them that they must love God with all their soul and strength.

Second Reading: Hebrews 7:23-28

Under the old covenant there were many priests, but Jesus will now remain high priest forever because he will live forever, and always be available to those who want to be saved. He does not need to offer sacrifice every day for the sins of his people, because he offered himself up in payment for their sins.

Gospel: Mark 12:28b-34

One of the scribes asked Jesus which commandment is the first, and he replied that the first is to love and honor the Lord and no one else. Jesus explained that they must love God with all their heart, and love their neighbor. The scribe agreed that loving God completely and loving one's neighbor is better than any sacrifice they could make.

NOVEMBER NOVENA

On Friday November 1st, we commemorated the Saints in heaven. Our faith tells us a saint is someone who is in heaven. While "saint" as a title is reserved to those whose lives the church has thoroughly investigated and named them a saint, the term applies to anyone in heaven. We should pray to these saints to intercede for us here on earth as well as those in purgatory. On November 2nd we commemorated All Souls Day, and, on that day, we prayed for all the faithful departed, those baptized Christians who are believed to be in purgatory because they died with the guilt of lesser sins on their souls. Roman Catholic doctrine holds that the prayers of the faithful on earth will help cleanse these souls in order to fit them for the vision of God in heaven, and the day is dedicated to prayer and remembrance. This novena will continue those 2 days of special prayers. The Novena will begin on November 3rd with this prayer:

Almighty God and Father, we thank you for the countless saints who have gone before us and are in heaven with You. We pray through their intercession that we may imitate their lives and give You glory. They showed us great lexamples of faith. Through them we ask for Your guidance and pray one day we too may see your holy Countenance in eternal life. Amen

Say the rosary.

The ending day will end on November 11th with this prayer:

O Lord God Almighty, we pray Thee, by the Precious Blood which Thy Divine Son Jesus shed in His cruel scourging, deliver the souls in Purgatory - and those souls especially amongst them all which is nearest to its entrance into Thy glory; that so they may begin to praise and bless Thee forever. Amen

HOLY SOULS

The church has set aside the month of November to remember the Holy Souls: the great company of the Saints in Heaven as well as the poor suffering souls in Purgatory. Purgatory is still a wondrous teaching of the church. As found in the Catechism of the Catholic Church (para. 1030) "From the beginning, the church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all, the Eucharistic sacrifice. So that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God. The church also commends almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance undertaken on behalf of the dead" We will place our All Souls envelopes on our altar throughout this entire month. At every Mass, we shall remember these deceased loved ones and commend them to God's mercy, peace and glory. A Mass of Remembrance will be celebrated here at St. Johns on Sunday, November 10th @ 8:30am. During this Mass, we remember, in a special way, all the beloved of our parish who have passed away during the year. All are welcome to attend as we commend our recently departed Brothers and Sisters to the mercy and peace of God.
