POOR BOX DONATIONS WINTER 2025 BENEFIT HABITAT FOR HUMANITY

Since its founding in 1976 Habitat for Humanity has worked in more than 70 countries and has helped more than 59 million people improve their living condition. By working together with families, local communities, volunteers and partners from around the world, Habitat has enabled more people to live in affordable and safe homes. Their advocacy efforts focus on removing systemic barriers that prevent low-income and historically underserved families from accessing adequate, affordable shelter.

Located in the Goggleworks (201 Washington Street, Suite 339 Reading), Habitat for Humanity of Berks County (HFHBC) began in 1988 on the belief that strong and stable homes build strong and stable families. Motivated by a vision to be among the major housing leaders in our community for neighborhood revitalization, HFHBC has provided affordable housing and homeownership opportunities for well over 60 client families and that number continues to rise. HFHBC is grounded in the core values of providing families with a decent place to live, neighborhood revitalization via home ownership, excellence in home construction and volunteer experiences, inclusion and diversity, respect and gratitude for those who give and those who receive, collaboration, and environmental and financial sustainability.

To keep the cost of homes more affordable for the low-income families who purchase them Habitat welcomes volunteer workers to the job sites and to the Habitat ReStore. All volunteers on the job site must be at least 18 years old, wear close -toe-shoes, and be prepared to lift at least 25 pounds. Volunteer job site schedules include Wednesday/Friday/Saturday from 9am-2pm. ReStore volunteer shifts are available Tuesdays through Saturdays from 9am -6pm.
